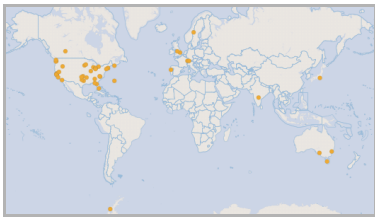
## Substance

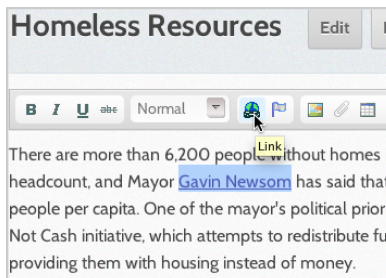

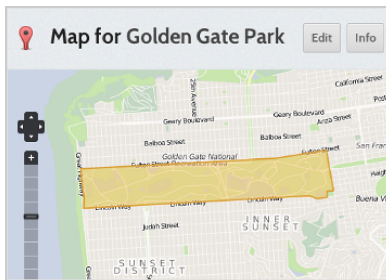
## The LocalWiki Platform

The LocalWiki project is powered by an easy-to-use open-source software platform that's designed specifically for the needs of local communities.



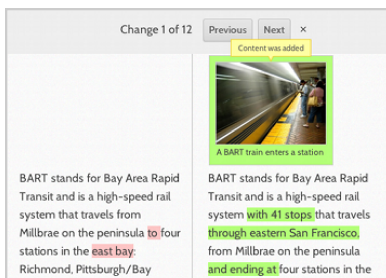
### Editing for everyone
